2013 Great Central U.S. Shake Out Earthquake Drill

Mark your calendars for the upcoming 2013 Great Central U.S. Shake Out Earthquake Drill to be held on February 7, 2013 at 10:15 a.m. Sign up today at www.shakeout.org.

To date, more than 800,000 people have registered to participate in the drill and related activities. This year the goal is to have 3 million people participate in earthquake safety, preparedness and mitigation activities.

Use this as an opportunity to practice additional aspects of your emergency plans and procedures.

Earthquakes can happen at any time and any location throughout Kentucky. It is critical that our citizens, communities and schools are prepared for natural disasters. A catastrophic earthquake in the New Madrid Zone of western Kentucky would impact not only Kentucky, but several surrounding states as well. The overall impact could equal or even surpass the devastating disaster of Hurricane Katrina in comparison.

Be aware of the recommended earthquake safety actions of DROP, TAKE COVER and **HOLD ON.** Earthquakes occur without any warning and may be so violent that you cannot run or crawl.

Individuals with disabilities and other access or functional needs may need to adapt the DROP, TAKE COVER and HOLD ON technique to meet their specific situation.

Kentucky State Police—Text a Tip Program

The Kentucky State Police have announced a new program called the Text a Tip program to report drugs, gangs, violence, threats, vandalism, abuse and other illegal activities.

To participate, simply text **67283** in the address field and type **KSPTIP** in the message field. Leave a space and then enter information about a crime. You will receive an instant confirmation text on your phone if your tip went through successfully.

The Text a Tip program is completely confidential.
